PASSING OUT PARADE

A colourful parade was held on the occasion of passing out of 13th Batch of Constable /Fire on 27.4.2002. A total of 81 firemen took part in the parade after a rigorous 40 weeks training schedule which included an 18 weeks module on industrial security training followed by a mid-term break of 2 weeks and 20 weeks module on fire training.

The parade was inspected by Shri Bharat Chandra, IPS, Principal Secretary, Home, Andhra Pradesh. In his address, Shri Chandra stressed upon the need for effective training in fire prevention, detection and fire fighting. He expressed the hope that the fire wing of CISF will match with expertise to meet the fire risks and that NISA will play a key role in updating and moulding the firemen suitably to boldly accept the growing professional challenges and come out with flying colours.

Welcoming the guests on the occasion Shri P.V.K.Reddy, IPS, DIG/NISA said in his address that

the CISF Fire Service Branch was constituted in 1969 and the first Fire Induction was made in Fertilizers and Chemicals Travancore, Cochin on 16th April, 1970 with 53 personnel. Today it provides Fire Protection coverage to 84 different Public Sector Undertakings with a strength of 5,027 including Power Plants, Steel Plants, ONGC Installations, Fertiliser Plants, Bharat Dynamics Ltd etc., which are very sensitive from

security and fire point of view. The CISF Fire Wing is known for its dedication and professional skills in the discharge of its duties. The training requirements of the fire service branch are of a highly specialized nature as it caters to the needs of modern and high risk industrial establishments.

Today the security scenario of the world is fast changing in the wake of September 11 suicidal terrorist attack on the WTC which claimed the lives of innocent people. The rescue services had shown exemplary courage and valour as some 350 firemen laid down their lives while rescuing the trapped people. In the view of

the fast changing scenario of the world, there is a dire need for extra alertness in our professional work. While pursuit of professional excellence is the primary goal of the Academy, we also strive to bring about attitudinal changes in our trainees by fostering love for trees, environmental changes etc. and there is considerable emphasis to make the training more meaningful, complete and integrated, stressing on personality development, character building and inculcation of human values through such means as yoga, meditation, etc.

AVIATION SECURITY TRAINING

CISF being entrusted with the task of provide security cover to most of the Airports in the country, there is a constant need for upgradation of human resources and technology for which training is the key. To this end, two courses on Aviation Security were organized at NISA during this quarter. While the
