### **DIKSHANT PARADE OF SUB-INSPECTORS/EXE (20<sup>th</sup> BATCH)**

A ceremonial parade was held on 21<sup>st</sup> Sept, 2000 at the Academy Parade ground on the occasion of the passing out parade of the 20<sup>th</sup> batch of Sub-Inspectors/Exe. Shri L.K.Advani, Hon'ble Union Minister for Home Affairs reviewed the parade consisting of 4 contingents.

Speaking on the occasion Shri Advani said that the decision to entrust the CISF with the security of the airports in the country was taken by the Centre after the Kandhar episode since there was a need to have special expertise in the field of Aviation Security. He further said that the evil designs of the enemy to destabilize the economy was as dangerous as the threat posed to national security by trans-border terrorism. It is in this context that the responsibility of the CISF personnel has become more important, he observed. In his welcome address Shri P.V.K.Reddy, DIG, NISA said that NISA as a Centre of Excellence in Security Management conducts courses not only to meet the requirements of CISF but also of other CPOs and PSUs. He also noted that apart from giving professional training, the Academy has strived to inculcate positive attitudes and

integrity of highest order for the holistic development of personality of trainees.

Earlier, Shri Advani laid a wreath at the Martyr's Memorial in honour of CISF personnel who sacrificed their lives while performing their duties. Later he presented Police Medals for Meritorious service to 15 officers including Shri P.V.K.Reddy, IPS DIG, NISA. He also gave awards to Sub-Inspector trainees who stood out in various disciplines after completing a rigorous training schedule of 52 weeks. The recipients of awards were Shri Ravi Ranjan Kumar, SI/UT who stood all round best, Tanweer Ahmed, SI/UT, best in outdoor. Pramod Kumar, SI/UT, best in physical training, Gurjeet Singh, SI/UT, best in Indoor and Dinesh Chandra, SI/UT best in Firing. The parade was followed by an impressive demonstration in fire rescue operations by the staff of the Fire Service Training Institute (FSTI) located in the NISA Complex.

The Hon'ble Union Home Minister later visited the Technical Centre of the Academy and showed keen interest in various modern security devices installed there, which are used in protection and security of vital installations and industrial premises.

**TRAINING CONFERENCE – 2000**

The two day Training Conference-2000 of CISF was inaugurated on 21<sup>st</sup> September, 2000 by Shri L.K.Advani, Hon’ble Union Minister for Home Affairs at the National Industrial Security Academy, Hyderabad. The Conference was chaired by Shri B.B.Nanda, IPS, Director General, CISF. All Sector IGs, Heads of Training Institutions of CISF and Unit Commanders of CISF units located in Hyderabad participated in the conference. Addressing the senior officers of CISF attending the conference, Shri Advani said that a nation’s strength would be judged on the power of its “intellect”. He further said that training institutions like NISA must attach more importance to a trainee’s “Emotional quotient”, “EQ” as he called it, and not only to his intelligence quotient. A person must also be judged as to how he reacted during a crisis situation because an intelligent person might fail if he lacked equilibrium or capacity to make sacrifice for the country. Earlier, Shri B.B.Nanda, IPS, Director General, CISF said that the Force was one of the biggest of its kind in the world, which was recently entrusted with the complicated task of airport security.

In his presentation during the inaugural session, Shri R.K.Shukla, IPS, IG(HQrs), CISF said that the 94,000 strong Force was engaged in protecting a wide

variety of installations relating to Oil, Petrochemical, Steel and Space industries besides nuclear establishments. The Training Conference was followed by Adm Conference on 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2000 in which important administrative matters were discussed. At the conclusion of the conference on 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2000, the valedictory address was delivered by Shri P.V.Rajgopal, IPS, Director, NPA, Hyderabad.

**FOUNDATION STONES FOR NEW PROJECTS**

On 21<sup>st</sup> September, 2000, Shri L.K.Advani, Hon’ble Union Minister for Home Affairs laid the Foundation Stone for the construction of 150 Single Living Accommodation for trainees at NISA, to be constructed at a cost of Rs. 468.05 lakhs. This complex is a four storeyed building with 150 rooms, kitchen, dining hall and recreation hall.

On 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2000 Smt Rajyalakshmi Sarma, wife of Shri D.V.S.Sarma, Addl. Director General, CPWD laid the foundation stone for the construction of the new Family Welfare Centre (FWC), in the presence of Mrs. Manga Reddy, President FWC, NISA and FWC members. The FWC with a built up area of 113.77 sq.mts is to be constructed at a cost

of Rs. 83.73 lakhs. It is designed to cater to the needs of over 400 families staying in the campus and will comprise facilities for Sewing Room, Cutting Room, Library, Knitting Room, Demonstration Room etc required for educating the ladies residing in the campus.
