The National Industrial Security Academy is a Centre of Excellence in industrial security and fire safety management. It is the premier training institution of the Central Industrial Security Force, engaged in organizing basic induction training and other professional and specialized courses for officers and men of CISF, police officers and corporate executives. The Mission of the Academy is to produce professionals in the field of industrial security management.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT COURSE

A course on Disaster Management for District level Officials was organized at NISA from 17.12.2001 to 11.01.2002. A total of 23 officers attended the course. The Academy had earlier organized three Vertical Interaction Courses for IPS Officers on the same theme. However, the

present course is the first interactive course for District level functionaries of different departments to be organized here. Inputs were provided, inter-alia, on concept of disaster management, disaster prevention, sustainable development, multi agency

coordination, contingency planning, vulnerability assessment, rescue and relief operations, information management and knowledge engineering in disaster management. The four week course also included a 12-day Observation Study Tour during which the participants were divided into two groups and taken to earthquake affected districts of Gujarat and Cyclone affected region of Orissa to gain first hand knowledge of

post disaster reconstruction scenario. The course thus provided the right blend of theoretical input and field study on the subject in an integrated, interactive and holistic manner.

In his inaugural address Shri P.V.K.Reddy, IPS, DIG, NISA said that Disaster Management is a multi-dimensional subject of seminal importance

across the world. While most of the natural disasters can not be prevented they can nevertheless be managed to mitigate the extent and scope of losses both in human and economic terms. For effective response in disaster situations multi-agency coordination and consistent and consorted response

is required. He further outlined emerging areas of Disaster Management like terrorism with special emphasis on Nuclear, Biological & Chemical terrorism, particularly in the context of WTC incident, Anthrax scare and attack on our Parliament. He further emphasized the need for nation as whole and armed forces in particular to remain vigilant in the present turbulent times to counter the emerging dimensions of disasters.

AVIATION SECURITY COURSE

A 02-week Training of Trainers course on Aviation Security was organized at the Academy from 03.12.2001 to 15.12.2001. The main objective of the course was to identify the emerging threats to Aviation Security and familiarize the participants with preventive measures required to avert aviation disasters and appraise them of crisis management situations. Faculty from Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS), Airport Authority of India (AAI) and Indian Airlines also interacted with the participants. The course assumes importance in view of recent events and the increased responsibility of CISF in providing security cover to airports of the country.

PROMOTION COURSES

Promotion courses for GOs - from Dy. Commandant to Commandant and Sr. Commandant to DIG - were organised in the Academy during this quarter. The promotion courses have been designed to acquaint the participants with the requirements of the higher rank and refresh and re-orient them to new developments in the professional field. Shri B.B.Nanda, IPS, DG, CISF interacted with the participants of the two courses on 05.12.2001 and stressed upon the need for improving professional skills particularly weapons handling in the light of increased threat perception from trans-border terrorism.

The programme included an Essay writing competition, Seminar, Debate and Quami Ekta run. During the road run in which Academy staff and trainees participated a 15 point programme on welfare of minorities was highlighted.

HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMME

A "Health Education Programme" for women was organized in NISA by the CDR group of hospitals, Hyderguda on 10.10.2001 from 1100 Hrs. to 1300 Hrs. to bring about awareness of Cancers, Menopause & Osteoporosis in Women. A total of 125 ladies and five doctors participated in the programme. The programme was highly appreciated by all participants and will go a long way in increasing awareness level about such diseases as early detection facilitates timely cure.

CONSTRUCTION WORKS

The last quarter of the year saw hectic construction activity in the campus. The construction work of Training Block, Single Living Accommodation for SO Trainees, (Block 'A'), 20 bedded Hospital, Bank and Post Office, Single Living Accommodation for SO's Staff and 400 Metres Track with Pavilion were in finishing stages.

The Training Block, a 2.97 crore project with 12 hexagonal Class rooms and offices will go a long way in catering to the growing training needs of the Academy which has emerged as an institution of national level in attracting officers from other organizations as well. Each class room will have a well structured sitting arrangement and will be equipped with latest training aids to provide the right ambience for meaningful academic interactions. The training block will have sufficient space for lawn and lobby and will also have a computer lab and audio visual cell. The other projects will contribute to the infrastructural development of the Academy. A new lawn tennis court was also inaugurated by DIG/NISA.
