**ATA-5345 EXECUTIVE COURSE ON CYBER TERRORISM**

The ATA-5345 Executive Course on Cyber Terrorism was conducted at this Academy from 12.06.2006 to 14.06.2006. A total of 20 officers attended the course. The objective of this short course was on the role of an executive responsible for monitoring and protecting government network components and identifying existing vulnerabilities that could cause catastrophic destruction to the network. The course dealt with the issues related to the ability of law enforcement officers to identify, prevent, investigate, and prosecute Cyber related acts of crime and terrorism. The course was inaugurated by Air Cmde PB Patel, Air Force Station, Hakimpet, Hyderabad. Addressing the participants, he told, "A natural progression in the modus operandi of the terrorists over the world has been the use of modern communication technology for all aspects of their operations, be it spread of ideology, planning of operations or even giving effect to their evil designs. Cyber terrorism can be defined as the use of computing resources against persons or property to intimidate or coerce a government, the civilian population, or any segment thereof, in furtherance of political or social objectives. Information technology, computers and the Internet have become integral to almost all modern terrorist outfits". Shri Anurag Sharma, IPS, Director NISA valedicted the course on 14.06.2006.

Ever since CISF was inducted in all the major airports of India, constant need has been felt to upgrade CISF personnel with the latest developments in Aviation Security. It has been the constant endeavor of NISA to upgrade all CISF personnel, who are deployed in Airports with the latest developments in Aviation Security. Keeping this in mind, the Academy conducted In-service courses on Aviation Security. NISA has been approved as training institute to conduct AVSEC Basic course by Bureau of Civil Aviation Security, New Delhi in the month of June, 2005. Since then this Academy has conducted 13 Basic AVSEC courses. The 13<sup>th</sup> Batch Basic AVSEC course for SOs of 10 days duration was conducted from 12.06.2006 to 22.06.2006. Apart from in-house faculties, faculties from other organizations such as Maj Aneesudhan, DCOS BCAS Chennai, Shri K Subramaniam from AP BDDS, Shri O S Ekka, Dy General Manager, AAI and Shri K V Jagdeesh, supervisor from Air Deccan were also called to share their knowledge and experience with the participants. Result percentage of all the above courses is more than 90.

A step forward in this direction was taken when the 1<sup>st</sup> Batch X-ray Baggage Scanning Simulator Course was conducted at this Academy from 21.04.06 to 24.04.06.
